Saint Gabriel Farm

Gabriel de Queylus, Sulpician

- Gabriel de Queylus arrived in 1657 and would play a role in starting the Saint Gabriel farm in 1659.
- He hired people in France and brought them here to clear and till the land.
- As was often the custom at the time, the farm was given the name Gabriel, which was Bishop Queylus' first name.
- For 200 years, the Saint Gabriel Farm would stay in the Sulpicians' hands.



Saint Gabriel Farm

- Fortified farm established in 1659 by Sulpician Father Gabriel de Queylus
- The farmhouse was located between St. Patrick Street and the canal in the middle of a vast terrain.
- The house, and the other buildings were demolished in 1883.
- Archeologists did survey the land in 2010, at the end of the summer.
